



Seed Distribution

Roy Skidmore writes: Firstly I would like thank all the donors, seed packers and helpers who worked with me to ensure the 2017 distribution ran smoothly and was successfully completed.

The 2017 distribution went well, especially with members' donations of rarer species, so more members received these rarer seeds.

For the 2018 distribution I would kindly ask all members to consider donating seed no matter how small an amount, especially the rarities (*C. colchicum*, *C. parviflorum*, *C. pseudibericum* 'roseum', *C. purpurascens* f. *album* and any white forms of from *C. alpinum*, *C. coum* and *C. repandum*). During 2017 we sadly lost Jan Bravenboer and Peter Moore who both donated large amounts of seed to the Society. Their donations were specific to rarer species and I am hoping that the generosity of our members will ensure that we can carry on providing a good quality service to the seed distribution.

For 2018 we will continue to have a single distribution instead of offering a full second distribution. The December *Journal* may offer an opportunity to apply directly to me for any surplus seed available at the end of the main distribution.

Free postage to overseas members for all their seed orders and free postage to UK members for their 'free allocation only' orders will continue for 2018.

There are no amendments to the 2018 general seed list.

The Nagoya Protocol

Wild-collected seed does not have a seed code on the General Seed List. The Cyclamen Society assumes that all wild-collected seed that might appear in our list or be offered as a 'special'

has been collected in accordance with the laws of the source countries and that its distribution is allowed under the terms of any permits to collect the seed. Genetic material collected from the wild since 12 October 2014 is covered by the Nagoya protocol, which is legally binding in the EU including the UK. For material from signatory countries, unless there is written consent from the country of origin, 'utilization' is not permitted. This includes development of new named cultivars and hybrids. Cultivation privately or commercially is permitted. Unless explicitly stated otherwise, you should not assume that seeds in our list have consent for utilization as described above.

Donation of wild-collected Seed

The reputation of the Cyclamen Society is at risk if we offer seed that has been collected illegally, or that does not have permission for distribution. This could do harm to future attempts by people who want to collect legitimately. The Cyclamen Society is not able to check every seed submission, so please do not submit seed that would put our reputation at risk. Please also retain documentation giving any relevant permission for as long as possible.

Donors

Fresh seed of all species/varieties is needed, especially rarities (see above). Each variety should be packed in a separate packet and labelled with the species name, varietal epithet and 2018 code if applicable. Please ensure that all seed is completely dry, clean and free from dried seed pod material. If you are sending seed of *C. persicum*, include the flower colour of the parent plant. Don't forget that *C. graecum* subsp. *anatolicum* has now been given species status as *C. maritimum* (Code 44). Will donors please be aware of this. Please ensure that donations

reach Roy Skidmore by 31 August. I am happy to receive donations after this date but I would appreciate you contacting me and letting me know that you will be sending seed later.

Applying for seed

Your application form is in with this *Journal*. Please be sure to fill in the form fully (including your email address) and add a 'large letter' stamp if applicable.

Only applications on the official form will be accepted. Please include your Society membership number (after your name on your membership card sent with the December *Journal* and on the June address label). Distribution will start in mid-October and takes four to six weeks so please do not enquire about missing seeds until early December. Please list adequate alternatives which should include different varieties from those already ordered. Where a variety is in short supply, donors will get priority. No member will receive more than one packet of any rare form or more than five packets of any variety. No non-donor will receive all rarities. Last date for receipt of all applications (UK and overseas) is 31 July 2017. Overseas members

All US members must apply for a small seed lot import licence from the USDA. More information on this can be found at: www.aphis.usda.gov/import_export/plants/plant_imports/smalllots_seed.shtml

Overseas members are advised to pay by PayPal (see opposite) or by limit cheque (see back of form) drawn in euros on a euro account or dollars on a dollar account. If this is not possible, seed will be sent to the value of the payment, substituting if necessary. Your list of alternatives is very important.

CSE seed

Seed from plants collected on Society field studies (each with a "CSE" number) will be listed separately. To get this list (available after mid-September), UK members should send a SAE to Roy Skidmore at the address opposite. Overseas members just send a self-adhesive label. The CSE list will also be available via e-mail at seeds@cyclamen.org. A special web page illustrating

many of the parents of the listed collections, in the wild, will be made available on the Society website: www.cyclamen.org.

Notes to holders of CSE plants

Please keep a careful eye on your plants to see that seed pods are not missed and omitted from the CSE seed distribution. Send seed to Roy Skidmore (address opposite) as early as possible and if it is not ripe or

none has set by 6 September, please let him know.

PayPal

PayPal is offered as a payment facility for overseas members only. If paying by PayPal, tick the PayPal box on the application form. Once the seed order is completed, a PayPal invoice will be sent to the member for payment to be made. Orders are then sent out once payment is completed.
